




Active Implementation Stages





Active Implementation Stages

Sometimes, we're in multiple stages, or need to revisit a previous stage...



what additional practices or approaches are available to support staff in working with the needs of our children that are emerging in implementation

Example: Training, coaching, or a program's policy might need to be adjusted based on initial implementation results...

Standards Implementation Process



HSPPS 1302.103(a)



A current program..., must implement a program-wide approach for the effective and timely implementation of the changes to the program performance standards, including the purchase of materials and allocation of staff time.

Consider a Standards Implementation Team:

Senior Management

Key Function: focus on overall approach and key timelines; outline how the program is progressing on its standards implementation process

Standards Implementation Team (cont'd)

Program Staff

Key Function: ensure each standard's content area is understood within an agency


Suggested Activity: Form staff content teams based on relevant areas (Parts 1302–1305) e.g. education staff address 1302 Subpart C; fiscal staff address 1303, etc.; these teams can focus on policies and procedures including volunteer management (if applicable) for each content area

Standards Implementation Team (cont'd)

Senior Management
Key Function: Review program leadership
infrastructure

Suggested Activity: Senior management engages governing body and Policy Council in examining/revising policies and structures to be consistent with standards (e.g. review policies and procedures if advisory committee used to oversee key responsibilities in program governance)

Standards Implementation Process



- Assess needs
- Examine fit and feasibility
- Form teams
- Develop communication protocols
- Identify infrastructure elements

- Programs consider forming Standards
 Implementation Team and HSPPS subpart task teams
- Leadership reviews communication practices to ensure staff, decision-makers, and stakeholders have the supporting documents and resources needed to move the program forward with the implementation process
- Senior management engages governing body and Policy Council to review and explore how the program leadership lines up with the new standards
- Senior management works with the governing body and Policy Council to explore and determine the agency's alignment with the new standards
- Program leadership reviews program goals and objectives to ensure they are in alignment with the HSPPS

Standards Implementation Team (cont'd)

Each task team could use the Head Start Management Systems: Guiding Questions for Implementing the Head Start Program Performance Standards resource as a guide

Each task team could make recommendations on needed procedural and/or budget adjustments needed to support key outcomes/results



- Develop infrastructure to support practice and organizational change

- Task teams use the Head Start Management Systems: Guiding Questions for Implementing the Head Start Performance Standards on Implementation resource as a guide to assess program systems
- Task teams outline recommendations around procedural and/or budget adjustments needed to support implementation


- How does communication between governing body/ Tribal Council, Policy Council, and key management staff take place in support of program decision-making regarding implementation of the new HSPPS?



- Includes coordinated approaches that ensure inclusion of all children and families
- Focuses on how data can lead to outcomes

Questions to Consider

How does our planning process support implementation of the HSPPS? Considerations should include:

- Community assessment review and/or update
- Goal and objective development/review
- Outcomes for children and families
- Coordinated approaches
- Action planning and time line
- Ongoing monitoring results
- Self-assessment results

- Program staff
- Governing body/Tribal
 Council members
- Policy Council members
- Community members and child care partners

Summary Question:

Will our thoughtful planning efforts around implementation support us in achieving our outcomes for children, families, and communities?



- Builds relationships with internal and external stakeholders
- Helps programs "tell their stories" as they pursue program and school readiness goals

- How does our communication system address both internal and external communication regarding implementation of the HSPPS?
- How do our communication policies and procedures address key issues and ensure confidentiality?
- What communication approaches are used to meet the needs of culturally and linguistically specific populations?

Standards Implementation Process

- Based on program leadership and task team recommendations and intake data, programs strengthen their management systems
- Based on task team recommendations (where applicable), leadership introduces course corrections needed to move toward full implementation

Initial Implementation





- Initiate new practices
- Use data for continuous improvement
- Strengthen the infrastructure to support practice and organizational change

Prior to getting started, have your staff review the management systems wheel to determine the health of your management systems.


Develop ongoing strategies for longer term benchmarks (e.g., considerations around extending duration and/or slot conversion/ reduction based on community needs).





Develop an evaluation system for assessing program outcomes within your five-year cycle.



Standards Implementation Process: A Summary




- Form implementation teams
- Establish communication protocols and reports
- Align goals and staff to HSPPS

- Revise policies and structures to match standards
- Use guiding questions to assess management systems
- Recommend procedural and fiscal adjustments
- Use recommendations and data to strengthen management systems
- Establish course corrections

- Use data and HSPPS to guide ongoing implementation
- Monitor key achievements over the grant period
