Establish a supportive learning environment for children, parents, and staff in which the processes of enhancing awareness, refining skills, and increasing understanding are valued and promoted.	
Recognize that members of the Head Start community—children, families, and staff—have roots in many cultures and languages. Head Start families and staff, working together as a team, can effectively promote respectful, sensitive, and proactive approaches to diversity.	
Understand the empowerment of families occurs when program governance is a collaborative effort among families, governing bodies, and staff, and when the ideas and opinions of families are heard and respected.	
Embrace a comprehensive vision of health for children, families, and staff that ensures basic health needs are met; encourages practices that prevent future illnesses and injuries; and promotes positive, culturally relevant health behaviors that enhance life-long well-being.	
Respect the importance of all aspects of an individual's development, including social, emotional, cognitive, and physical growth.	
Build a community in which each child and adult is treated as an individual , while at the same time reinforcing a sense of belonging to the group.	
Foster a relationship with the larger community so families and staff are respected and served by a network of community agencies that work in partnership with one another.	
Develop a continuum of care , education, and other services that allow stable, uninterrupted support to families and children during and after their Head Start experience.
