

STRATEGIC PLANNING FOR GROUPINGS

Activity overview: Participants look at the number of children and the number of adults in each class, then plan for how intentional groupings can happen in your classroom or program.

Directions: Answer the questions and brainstorm ideas about how groupings can happen in your classroom or program. Then create action steps.
