



TIPS FOR TEACHERS DUAL LANGUAGE LEARNERS

STAFFING

Teaching staff should reflect the cultures and languages of the children, families, and communities they serve, as much as possible.



When teaching staff are diverse:

- Encourage staff to learn about each other's cultural practices.
- Share information about communication styles (formal, informal, verbal, nonverbal).
- Discuss values related to child rearing and schooling.

When teaching staff speak the language(s) of the children:

- Use one language at a time during instructional activities.
 - Designate instructional times during the day in each language.
 - Organize staff so they know which languages to use for which activities.

When teaching staff do not speak a child's home language:

- Encourage family members to volunteer in the classroom, and support them in reading books, singing songs, sharing print materials, reinforcing vocabulary, and participating in other instructional activities.
- Recruit and train community volunteers who speak the child's home language to provide the child with language support during classroom activities.
