




Tip #1: Be Systematic in your Approach

- <u>Digital Markers of Progress</u>
- Fillable Action Plan



Tip #2: Develop an Elevator Pitch

- Identify your program's goal for engaging fathers
- Share the profile of the fathers your program serves (e.g., demographics, ethnicity, residential status)
- Present the opportunity for a partnership in service of fathers



Tip #3: Leverage Existing Partnerships



- Leverage knowledge, skills, expertise and existing champions in your program
- Turn to parent partners or governance board to help create and cultivate partnerships with agencies on behalf of fathers
