an early childhood strategy that can *enhance parenting skills* and promote young children's growth and development.

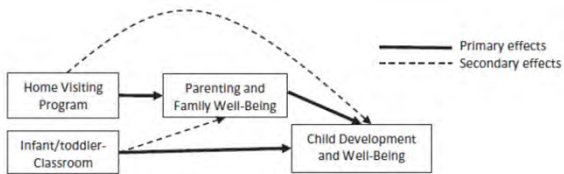


a program that helps families provide an environment that promotes children's healthy growth and development.

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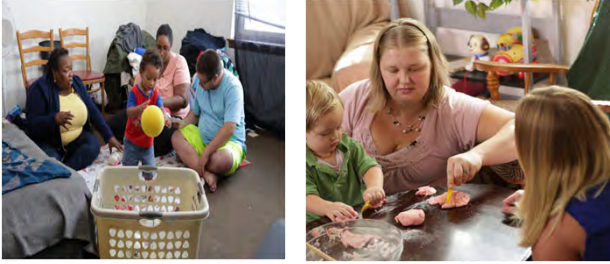

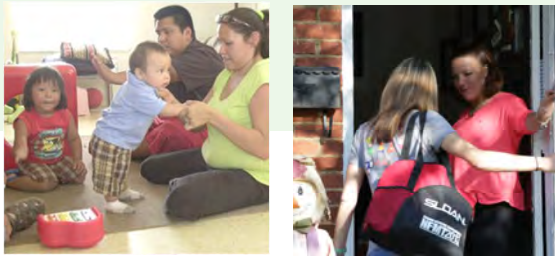
