American Sign Language

Learn about American Sign Language

- ASL is a visual, gestural language. It is a complete language with unique grammar and linguistic features.
- ASL is highly descriptive and uses space, handshapes, facial expressions, body positioning, and movement to communicate.
- Many people use ASL, including people who are Deaf, hard of hearing, a child of Deaf adults, people who are hearing, and people with disabilities.



• Children who are learning ASL are considered dual language learners in Head Start.

Benefits of ASL in Early Childhood

- ASL provides earlier access to expressive communication.
- ASL increases engagement with peers, educators, and families.
- Multisensory learning supports vocabulary recall.
- ASL acts as a communication bridge for children who are dual language learners.
- ASL fluency supports speech and English language development. Learning ASL has been shown to support the development of speech skills, English language development, and early literacy skills, regardless of hearing ability.
