

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### Definitions for Shared Understanding

#### **Advocacy**


- Advocacy is defined as any action that speaks in favor of, recommends, explores for a cause, supports or defends, on behalf of others.
- The act or process of supporting a cause, proposal, or person(s).

#### Leadership

 Family leadership is the capacity to interact in society with purpose and positive outcomes for children.

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### When Families Advocate, Everyone Benefits

## Research-proven benefits of family advocacy:

- Families share their Head Start experience with others to promote Head Start services.
- Families provide program information to other families who are looking for family and child supports to meet their interests and needs.

## Family advocacy impacts ERSEA through:

- Eligibility, selection, and recruitment linked to accessing and retaining more families
- Recruitment and attendance, which leads to improved family and child outcomes

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### When Families Advocate, Everyone Benefits

## Research-proven benefits of family advocacy:

- Families create welcoming environments.
- Families use strength-based attitudes and practices to foster parent leadership.

## Family advocacy impacts ERSEA through:

- Recruitment and attendance, which promotes diversity, equity, inclusion, and belonging
- Attendance that is linked to family and child outcomes, and increased family leadership and advocacy

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# The "How" Supporting Family Advocacy in ERSEA

- Provides opportunities for open communication and validates parent concerns
- Encourages relationships that position parents as experts
- Engages in culturally responsive actions that validate families' culture and values as assets



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# The "How" Supporting Family Advocacy in ERSEA

- Provides families with information and the "rules of the game"
- Pays attention to how information, communication, and leadership opportunities are presented so that all families have a voice and all children are represented

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### When Families Lead, Everyone Benefits

## Research-proven benefits of family leadership:

- Family leaders develop knowledge and skills, and they build connections with other families.
- Family leadership helps programs and schools better meet the needs of the children, families, and communities they serve.

## Family leadership impacts ERSEA through:

- Recruitment and Attendance, which leads to retention
- Eligibility and Selection, which are linked to placement

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### When Families Lead, Everyone Benefits

## Research-proven benefit of family leadership:

 Family leadership supports stronger communities that understand the interests and needs of the people who live there.

## Family leadership impacts ERSEA through:

 Eligibility, Recruitment, Selection, Enrollment, and Attendance lead to full enrollment

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# The "How" Supporting Family Leadership in ERSEA

- Supports parent decision-making
- Respects and recognizes parent's abilities
- Creates space for parent and family voices
- Genuinely considers and integrates the views and wishes of parents and families when program decisions are being made

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# The "How" Supporting Family Leadership in ERSEA

- Encourages parent participation in decision-making and governance
- Supports families as members of advisory boards and planning groups
- Showcases families sharing information about the value of early education within the community


