Professional development is the continuous process of acquiring new knowledge, skills, and abilities, along with experience and competencies that relate to one's profession, job responsibilities, or work environment. It encompasses all types of facilitated learning opportunities, ranging from pursuing and obtaining the CDA, college degrees to formal coursework, conferences, and informal learning that takes place while you are working. This is true whether you are a teacher, family service worker or other staff person.
